Pattern for a *Môgami sode.* (Approximately 3/4 actual size)

Tôsei (or *môgami*) sode varied in size from some 8" – 10" across, and from five to six lames (which also varied in width). That is why this is listed as "approximately" 3/4 actual size. The holes marked for lacing are only examples; the actual placement depends on the width of your lacing material (see the *sugake* spacing pattern for the actual spacing you will need). Likewise, the bottom-most plate can be plain with no cross-lacing; even when the *sode* was laced in *kebiki odoshi*, often the bottom lame had no *hishnui*.
